
Jesus Calms the Storm—Saddleback Kids

## **BIG QUESTIONS**



What are some of the things you find scary?

Who was scared in the story? What were they scared of? Who was with the disciples in the boat?



The disciples were scared of the storm, but Jesus was with them. When the disciples called out to Jesus, He heard them and kept them safe. We are living in scary times, but Jesus hears all of our prayers and even when things seem scary, we can know that Jesus is with us and in control.

Grown ups, can you tell the children about a time when you were scared, but God was with you?

# PRAYER

Dear God,

Thank you for the story of Jesus calming the storm which reminds us how BIG and **POWERFUL** you are.

Thank you that you are with us in the scary times and that you always hear our prayers.

We pray for those in the world who are scared at the moment; that they would know You and Your peace.

# **Activity**

You will need: paper, a large bowl/bath of water

Make your own origami boat together, you might want to make some paper figures to go in it as well. Float the boat in a bath, sink or bowl of water.

Encourage your children to help re-tell the story, they can make the storm by splashing the water or blowing hard at the boat.

They will need to listen out carefully for the bit in the story when Jesus tells the water to be still and stop the storm.

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## **MEMORY VERSE**

### **Psalm 56:3**

## "when I am afraid, I will trust in you."

Try to learn this verse together. You could come up with some actions to help you remember it or decorate the verse on a piece of paper or card together, and then put it up somewhere to remind you of it through the week. You could write each word on a separate piece of paper (use scrap paper or old envelopes) mix them all up then try and put them in to correct order.



# **GAME**

## 'Running Water'

#### For this game you will need:

H<sup>2</sup>O in liquid form

2 water holding devices (we suggest a couple of washing up bowls or buckets)

Water transportation systems (a spoon does the job nicely)

A non-carpeted floor (or the garden will do depending on how competitive you are)

Some towels (for when the water miraculously escapes the bowl and ends up on you or the floor)

#### Aim:

Each person or team has 2 minutes to get as much water from one bucket to the other as they can

### To Play:

Put each bucket a few meters apart (depending on how much space you have).

Fill one with water and leave the other empty

Take it in turns to race to see how much water you can move from one to the other using only a spoon or other family approved water transportation system

The person/team (if there are a lot of you) who moved the most water in the time, wins!

together as a family, this could be doing the actions together (if you don't know the ones we do you could make new ones up as a family, or ask the children to teach you our actions) or listen to the song and chat about what it means to you, dance around the room together, sing loudly, sing softly.

## HELPING OLDER CHILDREN

Older children might be asking why God would allow the current virus to hurt people in the world. The Bible tells us that we live in a fallen world, that God did not intend for it to be like this. We might not always be able to see God in our circumstances, but He promises that He will never abandon us, He is always with us.
